To teach Children & Young People (CYP) within the Education Provision (EP) while leading and managing a team of Teaching Assistants effectively. To be involved in EP development work and carry out other such associated duties as are reasonably assigned by the Head of Education Provision (HoEP).

The job description is to be performed in accordance with the provisions of the School Teachers Pay and Conditions of Service Document and within the range of duties set out in that document so far as relevant to the post holder's title and salary grade. The post is otherwise subject to the Conditions of Service for School Teachers in England and Wales (The Burgundy Book) and to locally agreed conditions of employment.

Key accountabilities, duties and responsibilities

Leadership & Management

- To coordinate Art across the EP
- To provide examples of good and outstanding teaching practice; including preparation and planning, classroom management and the maintenance of effective working relationships with CYP and colleagues
- To organise the effective deployment and direction of Teaching Assistants, within the classroom and support the development of an effective team
- To implement agreed Trust policies and guidance
- To support the School Improvement Plan (SIP) and contribute to the strategic vision of the HoEP and Governors (LGC)
- To participate in meetings which relate to the EP's management, curriculum, administration or organisation
- To communicate and co-operate with specialists from outside agencies to provide an effective multi-agency service and prepare reports on the needs of individual CYP as requested
- To participate in the performance management system for the appraisal of their own performance, or that of other Teachers and Teaching Assistants

Achievement & Assessment of CYP

- To set and evaluate individual termly targets and to maintain records of achievement for each CYP, in consultation with colleagues
- To provide reports and assessments for each CYP in accordance with EP policy and for a range of audiences, including a detailed report prior to the CYP annual review
- To ensure that effective communication is maintained with parents/carers about their CYP welfare, progress and participation in our EP community





Quality of Teaching & Learning

- To undertake a full-time commitment with CYP who are diagnosed with Autism and/or Social Communication and Interaction Difficulties often combined with challenging behaviour
- To ensure that there are appropriate schemes of work and effective teaching strategies which cater for CYP with a wide range of social, emotional and academic needs
- To provide a stimulating classroom environment, where resources can be accessed appropriately by all CYP

Behaviour, Safety & Care of CYP

- To be responsible for a class of CYP as a Form Tutor
- Support strategies which promote high standards of behaviour
- Promote and safeguard the safety and welfare of all CYP
- To maintain a safe and secure environment for CYP, in accordance with the EP's behaviour policy
